

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

The Board of Education expects its faculty and administration to regularly evaluate the educational program. Citizen groups, students and outside agencies may be invited to participate where appropriate. Such evaluations may be expected to lead to recommendations for modifications of practice, changes in content and new courses.

Curriculum development is the responsibility of the entire staff, but the leadership and coordination of the developmental process is the special task of the Superintendent of Schools.

After planning by the faculty and approval by the administration, new courses will be presented to the Board for their approval.

When the administration considers that an experimental course should become a regular part of the curriculum, such a recommendation will be presented to the Board for adoption.

Periodic reports on the state of developmental activities (of the curriculum) will be presented to the Board by the Superintendent of Schools, or his/her designee.
